

Interstate Movement Requirements

In addition to the federal regulations listed below, some states may have their own regulations for importing cattle from Minnesota. For specifics on a state's regulations, producers should contact their veterinarian or the receiving state's animal health agency. All shipments must meet or exceed state **and** federal shipping requirements.

	Modified Accredited Advanced	Modified Accredited
Feeder Cattle or Bison	No restrictions.	Negative TB test within 60 days of shipment. In addition, sexually intact animals can only move to an approved feedlot.
Breeding Cattle or Bison	TB test within 60 days of movement.	Negative whole herd TB test within 12 months of shipment and negative individual animal TB test within 60 days.
Slaughter Cattle or Bison	No test required if animals move directly to slaughter at an approved slaughter facility (federal or state inspected plant).	No test required if animals move directly to slaughter at an approved slaughter facility (federal or state inspected plant).

NOTE: A TB Accredited Herd can move animals without an individual test if a herd TB test was completed within the past 12 months and was negative.

General Requirements

All milk for pasteurization must be from an area that has MAA status or greater. If not, the state's milking dairy herds must comply with the Pasteurized Milk Ordinance.

	Modified Accredited Advanced	Modified Accredited
Milk Herds	No restrictions.	Annual negative TB herd test, accredited herd status, or a state surveillance program approved by the FDA, USDA, and MDA.
