Chestnut, American [Castanea dentata]	40+	40+	Round	Yellow	Sometimes	No	Partial	No	Yes	Although chestnut was decimated by the blight, trees grown from seed have shown varying tolerances to the blight, and grow for several years.
Elm, 'David' [Ulmus davidiana]	50+	35+	Vase	Yellow/Red	Sometimes	No	No	No	No	It is Dutch Elm Disease resistant, vase-shaped, and free from many of the other insect problems that plague American elms. In addition, it has an attractive fall foliage.
Maple, three-flowered [Acer triflorum]	25+	20+	Round	Red/Orange	Yes	Sometimes	Partial	Yes	Yes	Avoid alkaline or poorly drained soils.
Redbud, eastern [Cercis canadensis]	12+	12+	Vase	Yellow	Yes	Yes	Partial	Yes	Yes	Common eastern redbud from a northern seed source recommended over cultivars.
Sycamore, American [Platanus occidentalis]	50+	50+	Oval	Brown	No	No	Partial	No	Yes	Does best in moist soils, but fairly site tolerant. Interesting camouflage appearance to bark. Needs lots of space; gets anthracnose on a regular basis.
