

# how do you select A PROJECT

## 1. What kinds of things do you like to do?

What kinds of things would you like to learn about? After you figure this out, talk about it with your parents, leaders, and friends.

2. Look through the project guide. Are there any projects listed that fit your interests? Also, search for projects within your community. Your club leader or local Extension office can assist in your search.

3. Not quite old enough for 4-H but still interested in exploring your interests? Sign up for Cloverbuds! Cloverbuds is a program for kids in kindergarten through third grade that focuses more on interest development than project results. (Note: third grade students can register for other projects with the permission of their parents and local Extension staff.)

4. Is this your first year in 4-H? If so, start out slowly and focus on only one or two projects. If you've been in 4-H for longer, sign up for more projects to gain greater experiences.

5. Interested in animals but don't own one? No problem! You can still participate in an animal project. You even have the option of leasing an animal – just contact your local Extension office for details.

6. Finally got it figured out? Sign up for your projects on the 4-H enrollment form that you can get from a 4-H leader or from your local Extension office.
