During enrollment of each youth participant, adult volunteer, or youth volunteer they should be asked to indicate if they are Hispanic or Not Hispanic. Then they should indicate each racial group appropriate to their heritage. Each individual should be entered either in the Hispanic or Not Hispanic column, depending on which ethnicity they chose at enrollment. Each individual is recorded in the single row that best represents their reported racial heritage.

Enrollment data only need to be put into lines 1-10. The additional lines will be automatically tabulated by the computer program.

The TOTAL YOUTH figure used in calculations in Table 13.2 is the same total, with duplications eliminated, as is found in line 9, 10, 11, and 13.1J.

In group enrollment situations, where 4-H leaders complete enrollment on the group, they may use their best estimate of the racial and ethnic makeup of the individuals. The opportunity to report multiple races is offered principally so that youth who recognize themselves as being of more than one race are not forced to choose a single race for reporting.

While the new method of recording racial and ethnic data means that there are more possible blanks to fill, many combinations will probably never be used. The results of reporting in this fashion are likely to be a dramatic increase in the percentages of minorities served.
